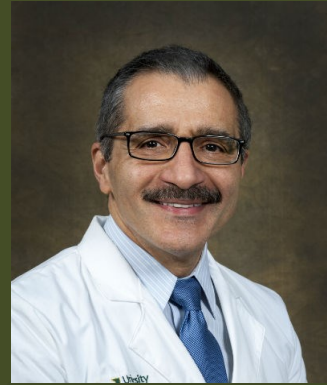

Message from the Chairman



To the Department of Medicine Family

The escalating COVID-19 pandemic is a major challenge to the healthcare system and to the community that we serve. During these challenging times, I feel grateful for your commitment, dedication and expertise as we navigate uncertain waters. I realize that such conditions may contribute to anxiety, uncertainty and stress. As a Department, we are at the forefront of combating this epidemic. Every member in our department, those who deliver the care and those who support the operations, play critical roles in the delivery of care. There are a few themes that are worth emphasizing:

- 1) Healthcare is a sacred mission. I am confident that we will rise to the challenge and work collaboratively to provide the best care for our patients and communities. Each and every one of us will have to do more so we can meet the needs of our patients, students, trainees and other members of the healthcare team
- 2) The health of our workforce is critical. We need to take care of our wellbeing as well as the wellbeing of our co-workers.
- 3) It is critical that we are up to date on the status and management guidelines related to COVID-19. Please make sure to read the daily updates from UPG, DMC and KCI.
- 4) To minimize disease transmission, we are developing plans to triage patients who are scheduled for ambulatory visits. We ask that each provider review their list for appropriateness of rescheduling or telehealth. Dr. Aris Urbanes is finalizing this plan and will be sharing it soon.
- 5) We are all in this together. I am asking each division chief to develop a contingency plan to ensure coverage of critical inpatient services and to minimize disruption should a colleague be affected by the disease.
- 6) All in person activities that do not meet the 6-foot social distance criterion will be switched to a virtual format. This applies to educational conferences and meetings.
- 7) We need every member of our department. Therefore, I am urging everyone to avoid travel to minimize exposure risk or the need for quarantine.
- 8) In the era of social media, we need to be thoughtful about the potential impact of what we share on our patients and colleagues. More importantly, we should NEVER share any information about an affected colleague without their explicit permission and always be mindful of our patients' privacy.

In closing, I would like to reiterate my commitment to consistent communication and transparency. We are ONE family. We care deeply about each other and about our mission. Recognition, Grants , Awards



Congratulations to Dr Lobelia Samavati, Associate Professor in the Pulmonary Critical Care and Sleep medicine , for receiving 1.98 million NIH award .

Dr Samavati leads a large clinical and research program in Sarcoidosis at DMC/Wayne State University.

A team of researchers led by Lobelia Samavati, M.D., associate professor in the Center for Molecular Medicine and Genetics and the Department of Internal Medicine at Wayne State University's School of Medicine, has been working for more than 10 years to discover specific serological biomarkers of sarcoidosis and tuberculosis.

With the help of a recent \$1.98 million grant from the National Heart, Lung, and Blood Institute of the National Institutes of Health, Dr. Samavati's research team seeks to advance their work of developing biomarker technology for identification of biomarkers of sarcoidosis.

Dr. Samavati developed a comprehensive library derived from sarcoidosis tissue that can differentiate between sarcoidosis and several other respiratory disorders. Using a high throughput method, her team developed a complex epitope library derived from materials of sarcoidosis patients. This cDNA library contains large numbers of epitopes immunoscreened with sera from patients with sarcoidosis containing high titer IgG antibodies and the cloned phages, which have been used to construct an antigen microarray to detect antibodies against sarcoid antigen(s) in the sera of test subjects.
